THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education allows school sponsorship of student fundraising for school-related activities or student programs, provided that such fundraising does not interfere with the educational mission of the district, and is conducted in accordance with state and federal laws. Because the board desires to protect students, parents, teachers, and school administrators from over-commercialization, great care and restraint must be exercised by school-level personnel in planning and implementing fundraising activities.

The purpose of this policy is to govern the initiation, authorization, and review of all student-involved fundraising activities at district schools. The district shall provide a framework for student-involved fundraising activities that safeguards instructional time, supports a common educational experience for all students, and includes appropriate accountability provisions.

The district will set forth its specific processes for implementing this board policy through the accompanying [administrative procedures](#).

No district employee or student shall be subjected to discrimination in employment or any district program or activity on the basis of age, color, disability, gender, gender identity, genetic information, national origin, pregnancy, race, religion, sexual orientation, or veteran status.
